2008 AHA Region 9 Sport Horse Championship Show Update

The 2008 Region 9 Sport Horse Championship Show will be held at the Heart of Texas Fairgrounds in Waco, TX, July 10-13, 2008. The Sport Horse Judge will be Charlotte Trentleman USEF "S" Dressage, FL; the Carriage Driving Judge will be Lore Homer USEF "R" Pleasure Carriage Driving, Combined Driving, PA. Sarah Jane Martin of Montgomery, TX will be our TD and C2 Steward. Charlene Lynch of Leonard, TX will be our show manager.

We are adding three Carriage Driving Classes in 2008 -- a working class, reinsmanship, and an obstacle class. The working and reinsmanship classes are shown in a very calm quiet and relaxed way of going. The reinsmanship class is similar to an equitation class where the driver is judged and then may be asked to drive a pattern. The obstacle class has a course set up of cones with balls on top that the exhibitor must maneuver through. The driver picks his course through the sets of

cones that he feels will be the quickest for his horse. This is an exciting class that features speed and accuracy and really gets the audience involved. We are expecting between eight and ten exhibitors and one exhibitor may even show a "pair/team" of horses. We have hired a long time driving judge and driving technical delegate that has agreed to help us design the course and we really look forward to working with her. We are having a wine and cheese party Thursday evening while we hold the three driving classes and we would like to invite you all to come.

The Sport Horse Regional premium will be combined with the Region 9 Championship Show premium as it was last year. All ad space in the premium is sold, but we still have advertising opportunities in the Sport Horse Regional Show Program, class sponsorships, and a need for silent auction items. Region 9 Endurance and Competitive Trail Championships

The Region 9 Championship 50 mile endurance ride will be held on Saturday, April 26, 2008 at the LBJ Grasslands, in Decatur, TX. We would welcome and encourage anyone qualified for this ride to come and ride. It takes at least one 50 mile endurance ride to be qualified to compete. If you are not qualified to ride the regional championship, this is a good ride to start on the path to learning more about endurance riding and getting qualified for 2009. We will be having AERC sanctioned 25, 50 & 100 mile rides in conjunction with the championship. Or come volunteer and learn about endurance!

Also, the AHA sanction for the Region 9 Championship Competitive Trail Ride will be sent in by the time this newsletter is printed. The date will be September 20-21, 2008 at Robbers Route Equestrian Camp, Wilburton, OK. The qualifying rides for this championship begin in March. All North American Trail Ride Conference [NATRC] rides are recognized as qualifying rides for the AHA championships. Anyone wishing to get qualified for the CTR should start this spring. It requires 50 miles of OPEN CTR miles to be qualified. There are 6 rides this spring to get qualified. To find the rides, go to www.natrc.org and click on Region 4 rides.

Anyone wishing to know more about endurance riding or competitive trail riding can e-mail me at rebelcjb@yahoo.com with a subject line stating which one they are interested. I will answer them as soon as possible. You can also visit the AERC website, the endurance sanctioning organization, at www.aerc.org or the NATRC website for more information on these sports.

I would challenge more of our Arabian and Half-Arabian owners to try these exciting sports. They are a refreshing way to spend a weekend. Just think- riding along on your trusted

horse through the beautiful country that God has given us, enjoying the scenery, the fresh air, and the peacefulness away from the city. Camping with friends is also a plus!!

The 2008 Region 9 Lifetime Achievement Awards were presented to Don and Judi Forbis, of Ansata Arabian Stud, by Rita McNair and Cathy Christiansen. Both Don and Judith have loved horses since childhood. Don jock-

eyed racehorses as a young boy. Judi rode in equitation and jumping classes. Don trained their Arabian racehorses in Turkey. Judi jockeyed them, setting a track record that still stands today. A respected author, Judi has lectured worldwide and has judged major horse shows throughout the world.

Celebrating their 50th Anniversary, Ansata was founded in 1958 by Donald and Judith Freni Forbis after they met and married in Turkey. They imported their first foundation stock from Egypt in 1959 including the Nazeer son, *Ansata Ibn Halima, and several Nazeer daughters. These horses re-established the popularity of Egyptian Arabians in America and today Ansata bloodlines and the "Ansata Look" are treasured globally.

Don showed Ansata horses to US National Top Ten halter wins, Judi has shown Class A halter champions. Both are active in Arabian horse circles worldwide, but have called Region 9 home for most of their 50 years – in OK and TX, and then settling in Mena, AR. Region 9 has been the center of the international influence and impact on the Arabian horse by these two icons in the Arabian Horse Industry.



Horsefest 2008 Features Parelli Clinic

The Level One Parelli Clinic given by Christi Rains at the Horsefest was a great success for all that attended. The weather was quite brisk but did not deter those seeking the fun and excitement of the clinic. Christi and some of her top students demonstrated many developmental steps of the Parelli program, and showed amazing interactions with their horses, playing at Liberty and riding bridleless.

Six participants were introduced to Parelli Natural Horsemanship with exciting results. Patricia Parmley and Elizabeth Summers hauled their Arabian show horses all the way from Arkansas to participate in the Parelli Clinic. Leslie Wills, a Houston Mounted Police officer, brought her handsome grey warmblood gelding to enhance his education as a police horse. Elizabeth Deden has adopted and trained four mustangs using the Parelli program. Ray LeMaster developed his leadership skills with his beautiful buckskin Half-Arabian mare. Tracie Mann developed confidence with her Akhal Teke mare. Tracie said, "Good communication skills are a very important aspect of my life and something I strongly promote. Christi really opened up the lines of communication between my horse and I in a way we could both understand!"

Christi taught participants the basics of the Parelli Seven Games to help nurture a stronger relationship with their horses. She emphasized concepts designed to enhance safety, and to achieve better results with their mounts.

According to Leslie Wills, "Although the Parelli home study programs are put together better than any other I have experienced, you

really need the eye

of a trained instructor like Christi Rains to properly progress to the next level. Christi has a talent of being able to connect with people who come from varying experience levels. She is easy to talk to and offers advice and encouragement at the appropriate times. I have seen great changes in myself and my horse since beginning Parelli. The Level One Clinic in Conroe offered me inspiration to continue through the levels of Parelli and eventually attain an instructor certification." At the end of the day, the group played with their horses using balls, tarps, umbrellas and other toys to help the horses get braver and smarter.

This type of training program is not only fun to watch but extremely fun to participate in. 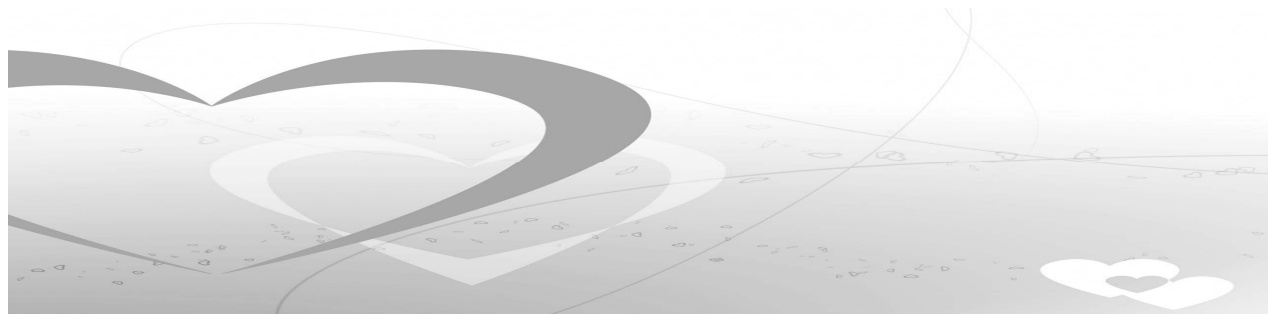
