Revenue generated by these gaming machines will be used to enhance the Texas equine industry, including the creation of a "Performance Horse Development Fund," which will provide a share of this revenue for improved incentive programs, additional added money classes, and better awards for performance horse activities [including Arabians].

Karlan Downing discussed the pending legislation regarding the Horseman's bill.

Financial Planning Committee: Charles Bass, Chair - Charles made a motion on behalf of the financial planning committee to authorize the treasurer to pay in the amount of \$9,362.50 for the futurity payouts for 2009. Cathy Christiansen second. Motion passed. Charles made a motion on behalf of the financial planning committee to authorize the treasurer to forward a check in the amount of \$5,700.00 (1/2 of stallion services sold at the auction) and up to 1/2 of any future sale of the remaining stallion services.
